



## 2024 – 2025 SCHOOL PROFILE

Cathedral Catholic High School (CCHS) is a Catholic faith community that serves students by preparing them for college and lifelong learning. Cathedral Catholic High School also provides the character formation necessary for students to become responsible global citizens. Cathedral Catholic High School was founded in 2005 (formerly University of San Diego High School, founded in 1957) and enrolls approximately 1700 students from the greater San Diego area in grades 9-12. Cathedral Catholic High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and the Western Catholic Educational Association. Cathedral Catholic High School holds memberships with the National Catholic Educational Association and the College Board.

### GRADING AND RANKING

Cathedral Catholic High School assigns letter grades using a 4.0 system. Letter grades are assigned as follows:

Dual enrollment, advanced placement and honors courses are weighted with one additional point. All credit classes are included in computing grade point averages. For courses that are remediated, only the higher grade is calculated into the cumulative GPA. Semester grades are recorded on transcripts. Grade point averages are computed in January and June. Cathedral Catholic High School has a rigorous college preparatory program; therefore, a cumulative ranking system based on GPA does not fairly represent a student's relative achievement. For this reason, CCHS does not rank.

OUR MISSION

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## TEST SCORES

In 2023 - 2024, 318 students took one or more dual enrollment college courses. These students completed a total of 665 semester courses. Furthermore, 594 students sat for 1186 AP exams. CCHS students scored 3 or higher on 75% of the exams taken. In addition, 210 students were recognized as AP Scholars.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions in California and ever-changing admissions requirements for colleges and universities, SAT and ACT scores are not included on our school profile.

**A typical schedule consists of 35 units (7 classes) per semester. A minimum of 280 units is required for graduation. Graduation requirements include:**

Dual enrollment, advanced placement, and honors courses have prerequisites that students must meet in order to be enrolled. Beyond the prerequisites, there is no limit on the number of AP/honors courses a student may attempt each year. The number of dual enrollment courses a student may attempt is limited by the community college.

## PRE-ENGINEERING PROGRAM

This college preparatory program combines advanced placement, honors, and rigorous coursework to adequately prepare students for further study in science, math, and engineering fields. Students will learn complex concepts represented in core academic subjects while developing critical thinking and problem-solving skills, working with real-world problems. Collaborative team environments will

create differentiated learning opportunities, as well as valuable group work practices. Technical skills will be introduced and enhanced through the use of industry standard programs and equipment. Completion of this program indicates an advanced understanding of these concepts and skills and is recognized on a student's transcript as having graduated with a distinction in engineering.



## SPECIAL EDUCATION

Cathedral Catholic is committed to providing an academic learning environment for all students.

### Learning Center

The Learning Center serves students with documented learning differences as evidenced through a Psycho-Educational Evaluation and resulting diagnosis. The Learning Center offers accommodations to support students earning a CCHS diploma.

### Options and Academy Programs

The Academy Program is a co-taught program for students earning a diploma based on CA state standards of diplomacy. The Options Program is an inclusive, non-diploma bound program for students who have intellectual disabilities and/or delays.

### Options and Academy Program Mentors

The peer mentor program is a year-long elective course for juniors and seniors selected to help the Academy and Options students navigate CCHS both academically and socially.

## VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

Cathedral Catholic High School offers a broad array of curricular options in the arts for all students, from the novice to collegiate level. Courses include offerings in traditional and contemporary visual arts, such as: 2D media, 3D media, digital media, film and broadcasting, as well as in the performing arts, including drama, instrumental music, choral music, music theory and digital music production. Our innovative approach seeks to provide strong foundational support in technique and historical context while fostering opportunities for performance application. In alignment with the mission of Cathedral Catholic High School, the Visual and Performing Arts Department prepares students to be lifelong learners and global citizens. It is our highest hope that pursuits of artistic excellence, through self-expression and collaboration, will lead to transformation in the lives of our students, as well as their communities.

## EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY

The Cathedral Catholic High School community is empowered with digital tools to guide students to be resourceful, creative and responsible digital citizens. Many of the teachers participate in monthly "Tech Tuesdays" to increase their knowledge about educational technology.
